

Here are the Yehe Village Amity Clinic pictures with Dr Yang (Yang Kejing).

Note that this is a different person from the one who works at the Amity Project Office in Ningxia. They have the same family name, Yang, but different given names.

This clinic building was basically finished in June with a little interior work yet to do and Dr. Yang hadn't quite had time to get everything moved in yet.

6-10 include hanging the Amity Clinic sign and handing the last part of our contribution that went toward the construction of the building.

11 = the examination table and sanitizing lamp had already been moved in

13-15 = Dr Yang (Yang Kejing) in front of the new clinic

16-17 = Dr Yang (Yang Wen), Coordinator in the Amity Project Office in Ningxia Health Department and associate professor in the field of medical examination of Ningxia Medical College,. explains to village doctor, Dr.

Yang (Yang Kejing), about the medicines we have provided for him to use in caring for patients who cannot pay for the medication they need for treatment. In 17, there is also an official from the county health office present.

15 -17 This part of the village is at the edge of a cliff. Scenes looking over the cliff to other fields, etc., part of the village on both sides of the ravine.

Here are pictures from the Hongxing Village Amity Clinic where Dr. Wang (Wang Yaofeng) is the village doctor. Notice, this is a different Dr. Wang from the last clinic. They have the same family name (Wang), but different given names.

The village is scattered both above and below the road, with the clinic in a central location, still below the road. From the road you have to hike down a fairly steep path.

2-3 Dr Yang (Yang Wen), Coordinator in the Amity Project Office in Ningxia Health Department and associate professor in the field of medical examination of Ningxia Medical College, and several officials from the county health office hike down that path to the village with Judy

4-5 Dr Wang (Yaofeng) comes bounding up the path to greet us.

6-8 Scenes as we approach the part of the village where the clinic is being built.

9,10,14 = The exterior of the new clinic is complete, but work still continues on the interior. Dr. Wang and several of his villager friends are doing the work themselves.

12 = hay and grass for fodder are stored nearby

11 = 2 of Dr. Wangs daughters play nearby

14-18 = Scenes of village homes and fields near the clinic.

20 = a path that winds from here up the hill to other parts of the village.

Notice the continuation of the path above the roof of the building (between the two trees). Dr Wang lives quite a long distance up that path.

Here are some pictures of the Jinhua Village Amity Clinic and village doctor, Dr. Wang (Wang Sixian) This clinic building was not quite completed when I visited in June. Dr. Wang was waiting for the cement on the interior of the walls to dry completely before he could put on the finishing touches and get moved in and that would take about a month and a half more or so after the June visit. Dr. Wang was doing a lot of the construction work himself and when we arrived he was doing some pointing on the exterior brickwork of the building.

13 = Dr. Wang (Wang Sixian) working on the exterior of the new clinic building.

7,8 = Dr Wang just outside the new clinic building

6 = Judy giving Dr. Wang the last amount of our contribution toward the construction materials used in building the new clinic.

1,2 = Dr Yang (Yang Wen) explains about the medicines we are providing for Dr. Wang to use in caring for patients who are unable to pay for the medication they need in their treatment.

9, Dr Wang is signing for those medicines.

10-12 Judy is interviewing Dr. Wang

Jinglin) about the medicines we have given for him to use in caring for patients who cannot afford to pay for the medication they need.

7 = Dr. Sun is unpacking the medicines we have given 8-10 = Dr. Sun standing just outside the clinic.

1 = The examination table in the clinic.

14 = Dr Ma (Ma Xuewu) is unpacking the medicines we have brought for him to use in caring for patients who cannot afford to pay for the medication they need in treatment.

15-16 Dr. Ma standing at the entrance of the Hejiagou Village Amity Clinic.

17 -18 scenes of village fields and homes near the clinic 19, 20 = Dr. Ma, his wife and children, his parents and a sister

22-25 = a village boy comes in with a sore throat and is examined by Dr. Ma.

Meanwhile, a woman whose baby has a fever waits.

26 = Dr Yang (Yang Wen), Coordinator in the Amity Project Office in Ningxia Health Department and associate professor in the field of medical examination of Ningxia Medical College, asks the boy some questions about his ear and exams him to determine that the infection is also in his ear.

The boy received appropriate medicine from Dr. Ma.

1-7 are scenes of the path going in to the part of the village where the clinic is located. This time you can see the drop-off at the edge of the path in several of the pictures. You can also see some village homes and some small fields used by the village farmers.

9,10 = Judy interviewing Dr. Ma (Ma Xuewu).

11, 12 = Dr Yang (Yang Wen), Coordinator in the Amity Project Office in Ningxia Health Department and associate professor in the field of medical examination of Ningxia Medical College, explains about the list of medicines we were giving to help in caring for patients who cannot afford to pay for the medication they need for their treatment.

Here are some pictures from my November 2004 visit to Hejaigou Village Amity Clinic and Dr. Ma (Ma Xuewu). Note, this is a different Dr. Ma. They both have the same family name. The one in the other village is Ma Tingfei; this is Ma Xuewu.

1-3, 5 = Dr Ma treating some patients using IVs

6-7 = Dr Ma outside the new clinic we helped him build.

8.10.14 = a few village homes and small plots of land along the path into part of the village and the clinic. Note that although it is hard to see from the picture, the edge of the narrow path is a drop off of maybe 10 to

12 feet or so. The car cannot drive up into the village because this path is too narrow. The path can be traveled on foot, by bicycle or by motorcycle.

11, 12 = shelves of medical supplies in the clinic

13 = Judy giving Dr Ma the final amount of money of our contribution to the building of the clinic.

Here are yet more of the pictures from my June 2005 visit to Tiegou Village where Dr. Ma (Ma Tingfei) is the village doctor.

32 = the road going up the hill to the other part of the village with a farmer coming down the hill in the distance with his cart.

33 = entrances to hewn out cave dwellings in the hillside

34 = looking out over a large family home of a villager living in a ravine between two hills

35-37 = looking out over some of the small plots of farmland used by villagers.

38 = the small plot of land across the ravine, just above the little bush, is Dr. Ma's. He grows potatoes there. It is quite a long way up the road from his home.

39-40 = scenes coming back down from the hills toward the new part of the village and the village clinic

41 = crops are planted and show some green, but are not growing properly in the drought. Unless they have rain soon, they will have little or no harvest.

44 = the newer part of the village, near the clinic. The government helped the people build these houses.

45,46 = Dr. Ma's extended family's home (parents, siblings and their families and his family)

Here are the rest of the pictures from the June 2005 visit to the Tiegou Village Clinic and Dr. Ma (Ma Tingfei)

18 = Dr. Ma is signing for the medicines we have provided for him to use with patients who cannot afford to pay for the medication they need in their treatment. The man waiting for his signature is an official from the county health office.

19-23 = Dr. Ma unpacking and checking over the medicines we have provided.

24 = Dr Yang (Yang Wen), Coordinator in the Amity Project Office in Ningxia Health Department and associate professor in the field of medical examination of Ningxia Medical College, looking at the water level in their cistern in this drought season.

26 = the old mud-walled tiny village clinic before we helped them build the new one last November

25 = the clinic building completed in November 2004

Ma (Ma Tingfei) taken in November 2004. In recent years the government has been helping villagers move from the hills up the road to its current site.

The clinic was built in November in the new site of the village.

However, villagers are still scattered with some in the old area and some in the new.

Some of the villagers in the old area still live in hand-hewn caves while others live houses built with mud-clay. The farming village has also faced some natural disasters--heavy hail ruining crops in May 2004 and drought ruining crops in all of 2005.

1-3, 5,6 = the outside of the clinic building, with two pictures being the process of hanging the Amity Clinic sign. In addition to Dr. Ma (Ma

Tingfei) and some family members, there are several officials from the county health office helping.

7 = Judy interviewing Dr Ma inside the newly built clinic building

8 = Dr. Ma standing next to the examination table in the new clinic building 9, 10 = looking across the road at some of the homes in the new village site and up the road that eventually goes to the old village site in the hills behind.

11 = the cistern and small field beside Dr. Ma's home. These support his family. In the distance, you can see more village homes and small plots of land.

12 = Dr. Ma by the medicine cabinet in the clinic.

10 = a blackboard just outside the clinic provides health education for the villagers. Right now it talks about AIDS and HIV transmission.
11= Dr. Liu standing at the door of the clinic.
12 = a bed in one room of the clinic for any patient that might need to stay the night for care.

Here are some pictures of Dr Liu Yaohui and the Madian Village Amity Clinic in November 2004 just after the new clinic building was completed. Dr. Liu was just in the process of moving from his tiny old mud-hut clinic to the new three room Amity Clinic that would help in caring for his patients.

99, 100 = the old clinic with two tiny rooms barely bigger than closets.
103, 104 = the outside of the Amity clinic completed in November 2004
102 = looking into the new clinic at a stove to provide heat and boil water in the winter. Dr. Yang (Yang Wen), Coordinator in the Amity Project Office in Ningxia Health Department and associate professor in the field of medical examination of Ningxia Medical College, is looking it over.
105, 106 = Judy interviewing Dr. Liu in his parents' home
107 = Dr Liu and his wife and child in his parents' home The village is in two places about 1/2 mile apart.
108 = a scene looking at some of the farmland of villagers nearest the clinic.
101 = a scene looking from the road over an orchard and on into the 2nd part of the village about 1/2 mile from the clinic

Here are some pictures of Dr Han (Han Hongxia) and the Shibali Village Amity Clinic. The clinic building was just finished in June 2005. Before that Dr. Han saw patients in her home.

1-4 = some general scenes inside the clinic, one of which contains a side view of Dr. Han.
5a, 6 = Dr. Yang (Yang Wen), who is [Coordinator in the Amity Project Office in Ningxia Health Department and associate professor in the field of medical examination of Ningxia Medical College](#), explains to Dr. Han about the medicines we have brought for her to use in treating patients who cannot afford to pay for the medication they need.
12 = an official from the county health office also discusses the use of the medicines we have provided with Dr. Han
7, 13-16 = [show the outside of the clinic and include the hanging of the Amity Clinic sign and the handing over of the last allotment of money that was our ABC contribution to the building of the clinic](#)

Here are the rest of the pictures from my June visit to the Houchuan Village Amity Clinic and Dr. Hai (Hai Yang).

6 = Dr. Hai with his wife and baby at the entrance to their home built a year ago fall.
17 = Dr. Hai and his mother and his child on the kang (the special bed made

of bricks and heated with a fire underneath in the winter) in his home built a year ago fall.

18 = Dr. Hai, his wife and child and parents outside his home.

19 = Dr. Hai signs for the receipt of the medicines we have provided for him to use in treating villagers who cannot afford to pay for the medicines they need. The man with him is an official from the county health office.

20, 21 = Dr. Hai serves us noodles made from the wheat he grew with vegetables he also grew. This is a part of their gratitude for our help and their hospitality for us.

22 = Dr. Hai's wife gives a gift of cross-stitch insoles that she has made her self, also adding her words of gratitude for our support of the medical work of her husband in their village.

23 = walking back down the path to the car left on the dirt road a ways from the village. See the wheat fields in the foreground, the white car further back on the right (just at the beginning of the path). Villagers live scattered throughout these hills and valleys.

24, 25, 26 = general sceens of farms and farm animals not too far down the road from the clinic.
