The white cross container arrives on a truck at CBCO. A storage container at CBCO has been emptied so that the supplies can be stored there until they can be dispatched.



The shipping container is offloaded by a willing crew of workers at CBCO. Wrestling 200 pound boxes of roller bandages is no small task!





They are stacked into the container at CBCO according to destination to facilitate loading them onto the truck that will take the up and down country
