In 1989, Dr. Hollis & Wanda Clark realized the big need for the eye care that was in the city of Cap-Haitian, the second largest city of Haiti. Many people had no where to turn for eye care. Dr. Clark came back to the United States and studied ophthalmology. After receiving his degree he then went back to Haiti and started the Cap-Haitian Eye Center.

The Cap-Haitian Eye Center is one of the most important institutions offering the best quality service to the people of Haiti. Every day the eye center sees between 70, 80 or 90 patients and an average 800 patients monthly. There are about 40 surgeries each week.

The Eye center uses one full time doctor and a second one is a part time doctor. There are seven nurses and two maintenance persons working daily. Missionary Nzunga Mabudia is the administrator who oversees the eye center.

The eye center is open daily Monday through Friday from 8:00- AM (to the last patient), and periodically on Saturdays for the general maintenance of the center and screening the eye glasses. The Eye Center does not discriminate against anyone for regardless of income.
