Kangpokpi was established by the American Baptist missionaries in 1920 after the 1st World War. Dr. G. G. Crozier and his wife were the founders.

A Leprosy treatment centre was opened and a Leprosy colony built as well as an orphanage for children. They were provided shelter and an education. The mission centre became well known all over Manipur and the neighboring country of Myanmar for its medical work and other activities.

The hospital during WWII closed down, but after the war Dr. F. Curry MD an American Baptist Missionary, was sent from Jorhat and the hospital once again acceptance.

The Kangpokpi Hospital today work predominantly among the “tribal Hills” of Manipur which have poor communication and connectivity with the big Centers. The majority of people are poor economically with little means of going to Imphal, the capital city for treatment which is 45 kms away, but takes two to three hours by bus due to bad roads.

Our Operation theatre is the only one functioning beyond Imphal along the highway to Kohima Nagaland (approx. 150 kms)

Kangpokpi provides the following services:

Laboratory
X-Ray
Ultrasonography services

A community outreach program is provided for sub-centers and Health Camps. They work along side of the government in Immunizations for “Safe Motherhood”
