

**Nekursini Christian Hospital**  
**PO Khatnagar**  
**District Paschim, Midnapore, West Bengal India**

The Nekursini Christian Hospital is one of the health care programs developed by the American Baptist Missionaries in cooperation with the native leadership of the Bengal Orissa Bihar Mission and was established on January 24, 1965.

The medical missionary work began by the American Baptist Mission Society in 1953. Two centers were built with its first Center at Salgadia, Midnapore, West Bengal and the second center in 1955 at Panchkahania, Midnapore, West Bengal. These two areas were very remote with no possibilities of any medical aid. Beginning with these small mission centers the need was felt for an organized mission hospital where major sickness could be treated. This led to take at the time the Nekursini mission center over 12 years and build a hospital.

The services provided and those needs being met are as follows:

Out Patients services - For general treatment such as fever, diarrhea, dysentery, eye treatment, gynecology, skin problems and pediatrics

In-patients service - Mostly for surgeries and prolong sickness.

Mobile Clinics – These are organized on a weekly bases and go to remote villages where there is no hospitals. The mobile team includes a doctor, a lab technician, pharmacist and nurse. The team carries essential medications and test reagents.

Surgeries – The hospital has a operation theater equipped with the basic tools being used for most of the common surgeries.

X-Ray – It is a facility that is not only used by the Nekursini hospital but other hospitals in the surrounding area.

Medicine Store – It is managed and run by the hospital where people can come and buy their medications.
